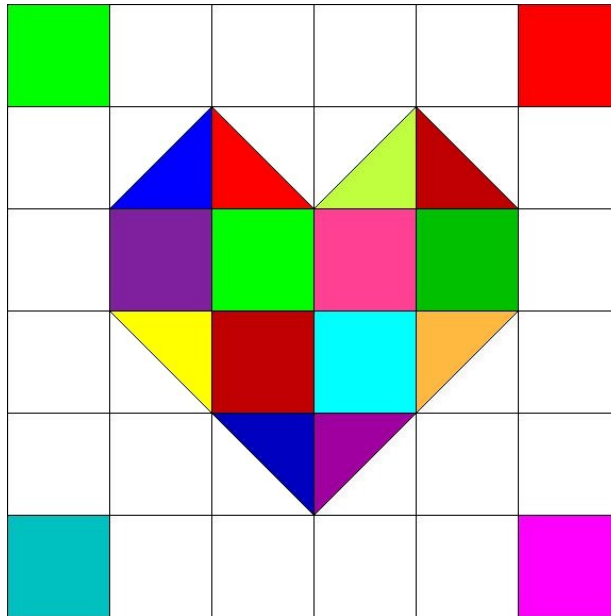


SCRAPPY HEART BLOCK

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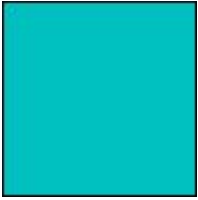

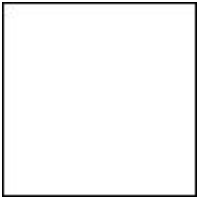

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Block Size – 12” (12.5” unfinished)

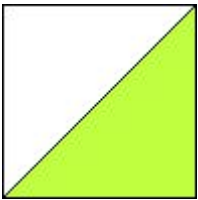
Fabric Requirements:



(10) assorted colored 2.5” squares per block



(18) background 2.5” squares per block



(8) 2.5” HSTs in various color per block

Cutting Directions:

Cut a good supply of 2.5” squares from your scraps and FQs. It is always nice to have a little stash of these squares.

You can make your background scrappy too with squares of light, neutral colored fabrics.

Making HSTs:

You will be using one background 2.5" square and one colored 2.5" square per HST.

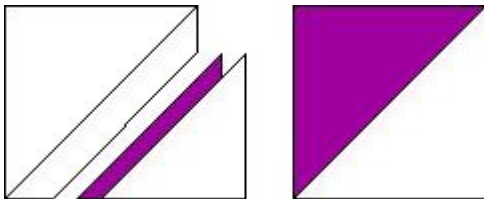
Draw a diagonal line through the center back of the background HST.

Place squares right side together.

Sew on the diagonal line.

Trim $\frac{1}{4}$ " from diagonal line on one side.

Press to the dark.



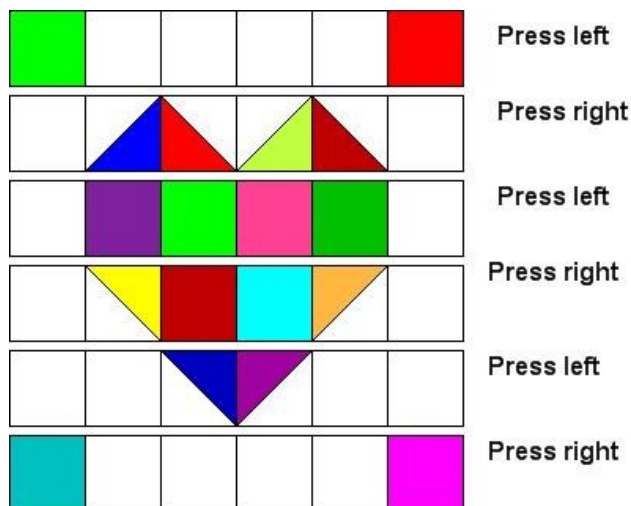
Assemble your block:

Lay out the pieces for your block in rows according to the diagram.

You will have six rows.

Press each row in alternating directions so you can nest the seams.

Sew your rows together. Press down or up.



Here is a picture of a quilt I made recently using this block. One day I might make a pattern for this quilt too.
