

# MY DAUGHTER'S WEDDING QUILT

Free Quilt Pattern

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*My daughter loves Hawaii, batiks and purple.  
The binding on this quilt is purple dupioni silk left over from the  
bridesmaid dresses.*

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**Feel free to contact me if you have any questions.**

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**Quilt Size – Full -96” by 96” or Queen-100” by 100”**

**Block Size – 12” (12.5” unfinished)**

## **The Challenges of this Quilt**

It is important to follow the pressing pattern closely.  
You want the seams to nest when you join the blocks.









The blocks around the edge of the quilt are slightly different.  
Please note the color changes for these blocks.

It is also *critical* to always know where the top of the block is.  
It is easy to get confused and turn blocks sideways or upside down.

Place a straight pin in the TOP of each of your blocks.  
You will know at a glance if your blocks are correctly oriented when you  
sew them together.

**If you want to make the quilt using two alternating blocks (no color changes for the outside) then make (32) of Block A-1 and (32) of block B-1.**

## Fabric Requirements:






A.		1 yard
B.		1 ½ yards
C.		¾ yard
D.		¾ yard
E.		2 ¾ yards (2 yards if not adding a border)
F.		2 ¼ yards
G.		1 yard
H.		1 ¾ yards



### Cutting Directions:

Label some small plastic bags A through H.

Place cut pieces in the corresponding baggies when done cutting.

**WOF** is **Width of Fabric** – usually 42” - 45” depending on the fabric.




<b>A.</b> 	(8) 4.5” by <b>WOF</b> strips	(64) 4.5” squares
<b>B.</b> 	(11) 4.5” by <b>WOF</b> strips	(96) 4.5” squares
<b>C.</b> 	(9) 2.5” by <b>WOF</b> strips	(144) 2.5” squares
<b>D.</b> 	(10) 2.5” by <b>WOF</b> strips	(150) 2.5” squares
<b>E.</b> 	<b>Optional Border                      for a Queen Size Quilt</b> (10) 2.5” by <b>WOF</b> strips	<b>Sew Strips</b> (2) 2.5” by 96.5” strips (2) 2.5” by 100.5” strips










<b>F.</b> 	<b>(32) 2.5" by WOF strips</b>	<b>(512) 2.5" squares</b>
<b>G.</b> 	<b>(12) 2.5" by WOF strips</b>	<b>(192) 2.5" squares</b>
<b>H.</b> 	<b>(22) 2.5" by WOF strips</b>	<b>(342) 2.5" squares</b>

**Chain Sew These Units Together. NO Pressing Yet.**




Label 15 small plastic bags 1-12, 14, 15 and 20

Place these units into the appropriate bag when finished sewing.

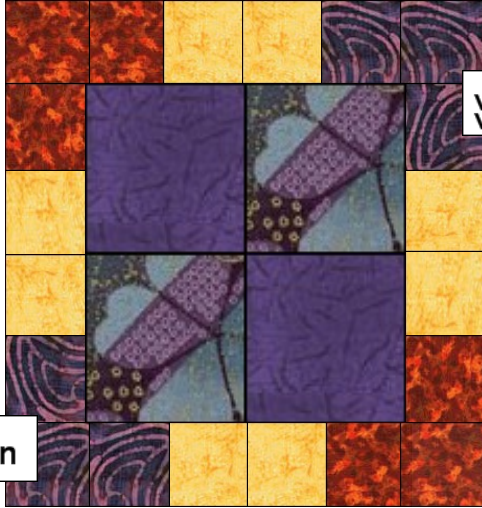
## Sewing A Blocks

13		<p><b>Unit 13</b>  <b>Make (64)</b>  <b>pairs.</b></p> <p><b>Use Squares</b>  <b>from A &amp; B</b></p>
14		<p><b>Unit 14</b>  <b>Make (32)</b>  <b>4-Patch</b></p> <p><b>Use Unit 13</b></p>
15		<p><b>Unit 15</b>  <b>Make (18)</b>  <b>Units</b></p> <p><b>Use units 6</b>  <b>and 14.</b></p>

**16- Block A-1**

# Sewing B Blocks

<p><b>20</b></p> <p>Place PIN in the top of each Unit.</p> 	<p><b>Unit 20</b> <b>Make (32)</b></p> <p><b>Use Squares from B and Use Units 11 and 12</b></p>
<p><b>21 – Block B-1</b></p> <p>Place PIN in the top of each Unit.</p> 	<p><b>Block B-1</b> <b>Make (18)</b></p> <p><b>Use Units 5, 10, 20</b></p>

**22 – Block B-2**

Place PIN in the top of each Unit.



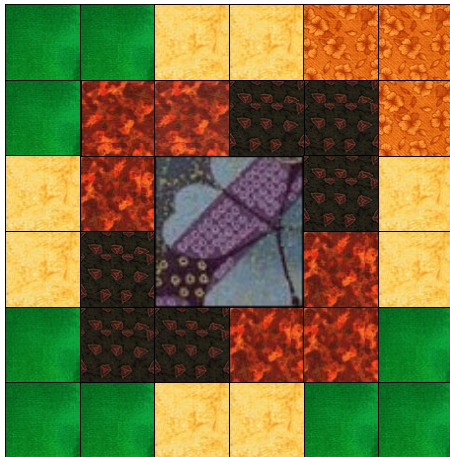
**Block B-2

**23 – Block B-3**

Place PIN in the top of each Unit.

## Assembling Your Quilt:

Sew your rows together.

Press each row in the opposite direction of the row above.

Sew rows together, nesting seams.

Press these seams down.

Top Row	A-2	B-2	A-3	B-2	A-3	B-2	A-3	B-2
Rows 2, 4, 6	B-3	A-1	B-1	A-1	B-1	A-1	B-1	A-7
Rows 3, 5, 7	A-6	B-1	A-1	B-1	A-1	B-1	A-1	B-2
Bottom Row	B-3	A-4	B-3	A-4	B-3	A-4	B-3	A-5

Optional: Sew on border strips from E.

Your quilt top is finished!
