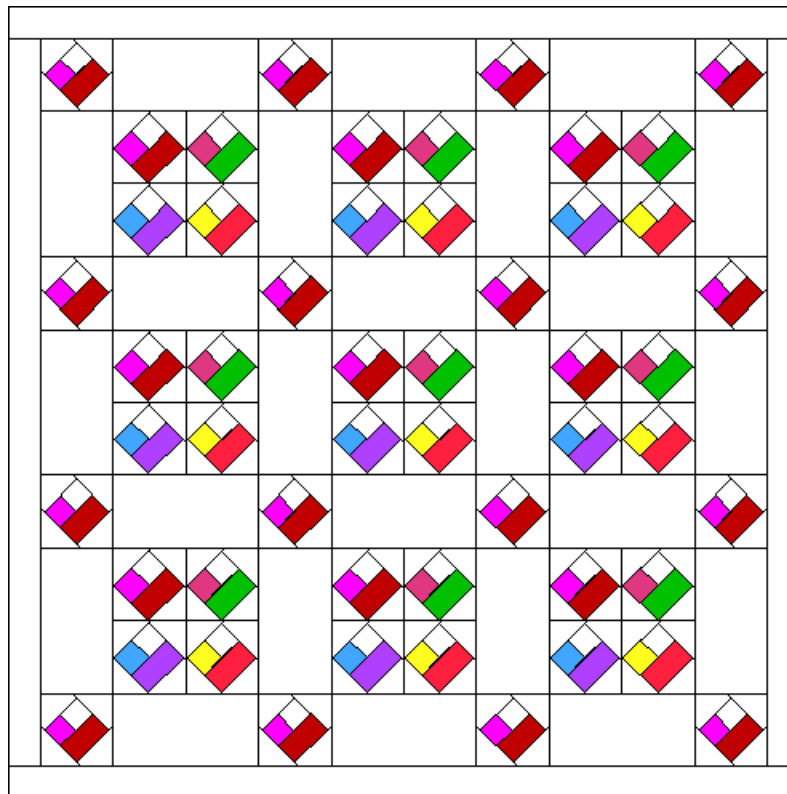

Doll Quilt – 22” by 22” (56cm by 56cm)

Baby Quilt – 49” by 49” (125cm by 125cm)

Comfort Quilt – 76” by 76” (193cm by 193cm)

Twin Quilt – 76” by 89.5” (193cm by 228cm)

Full/Queen Quilt – 89.5” by 89.5” (228cm by 228cm)

Individual Heart Block – 5” unfinished, 4.5” finished

Scrappy Four Patch Heart Block – 9.5” unfinished, 9” finished

Fabric Requirements:

Heart Fabric

	Doll	Baby	Comfort	Twin	Full/Queen
2" scrappy squares	8	52	136	162	193
2" by 3.5" scrappy rectangles	8	52	136	162	193

Background Fabric

	Doll	Baby	Comfort	Twin	Full/Queen
Background Fabric	½ yard	2 ½ yards	5 yards	6 yards	7 yards

Cutting Background Fabric

First cut Width of Fabric (WOF) strips from your background fabric:

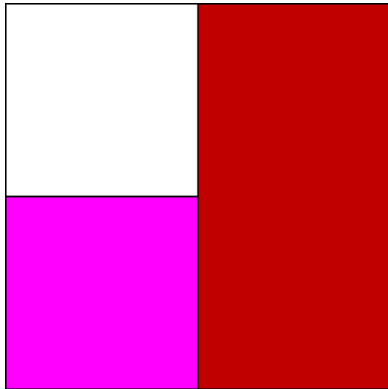

2" by WOF	0	2	5	6	8
3 ½" by WOF	2	9	23	27	33
5" by WOF	1	0	1	0	1
9.5" by WOF	0	3	7	9	10
2.5" by WOF	2	5	8	8	9

Cross cutting your strips:

5" strips Cut 5" by 9.5" rectangles	4	0	4	0	4
9.5" strips Cut 9.5" by 5" rectangles	0	24	56	71	80
3 ½" squares All cut from 3.5" strips.	16	104	272	324	386
2" squares	(8) squares from remnants of the other strips.	52 (42) from WOF strips. (10) squares cut from remnants of the other strips.	136 (105) from WOF strips. (31) squares cut from remnants of the other strips.	162 (126) from WOF strips. (36) squares cut from remnants of the other strips.	193 (189) from WOF strips. (25) squares cut from remnants of the other strips.
2.5" rectangles	Cut (2) at 2.5" by 18.5" Cut (2) at 2.5" by 22.5"	Cut and Piece (2) at 2.5" by 45.5" (2) at 2.5" by 49.5"	Cut and Piece (2) at 2.5" by 72.5" (2) at 2.5" by 76.5"	Cut and Piece (2) at 2.5" by 76.5" (2) at 2.5" by 86"	Cut and Piece (2) at 2.5" by 90" (2) at 2.5" by 86"

Making the Scrappy Four Patch Heart Block:

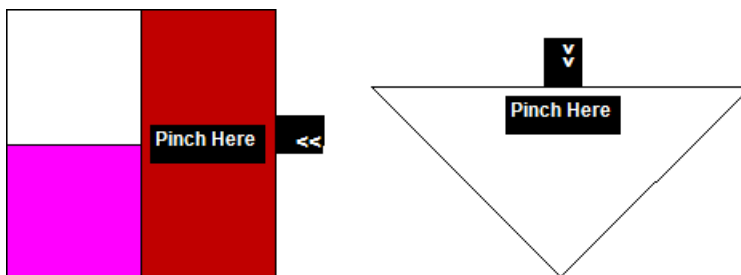
1. Sew (1) colored 2" square to (1) background 2" square.
2. Press in either direction.
3. Place background block on top
4. Place rectangle to the right
5. Sew.. making sure your square looks like the picture.
6. This square measure 3.5".
7. Make (4) for each block in your quilt plus the ones that go in the sashing strips.



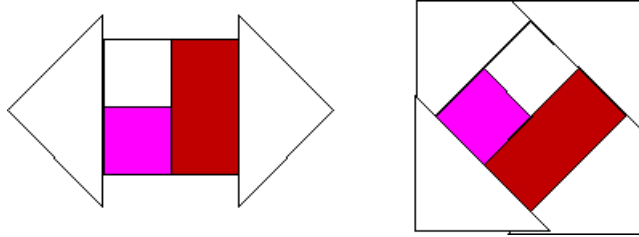
Number of hearts needed for each size quilt:

Doll	Baby	Comfort	Twin	Full/Queen
8	52	136	162	193

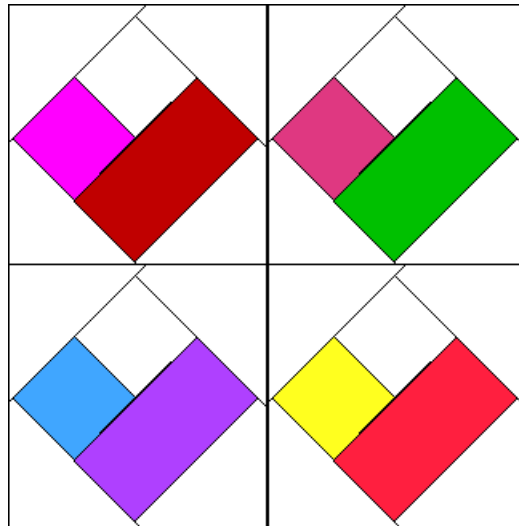
8. Cut each of the 3.5" squares in half diagonally.
9. Fold in half on the longest edge and pinch the center.
10. Fold the rectangle side of the square in half and pinch the center.



11. Sew (2) triangles to either side. Press to the triangles.
12. Sew (2) triangles to the other two sides. Press to the triangles.
13. Trim to 5" square.



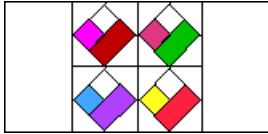
14. To make the block sew (4) hearts together, nesting seams.



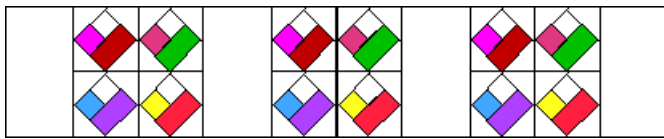
Join blocks together with sashing strips:

Sash blocks together with the 5" by 9.5" rectangles according to the diagrams below.

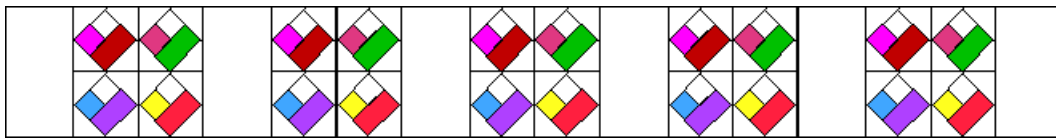
Doll Quilt – Make (1) Row



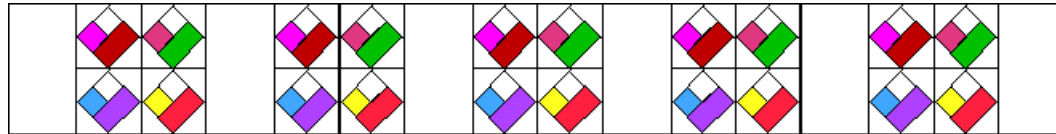
Baby Quilt – Make (3) Rows

Full/Queen – Make (6) Rows

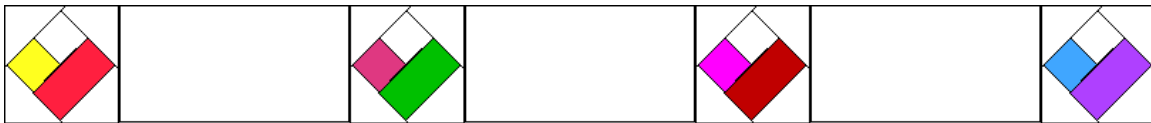


Sew Sashing Rows according to diagrams:

Doll Quilt – Make (2) Rows



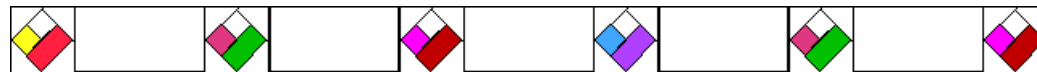
Baby Quilt – Make (4) Rows

Twin Quilt – Make (7) Rows



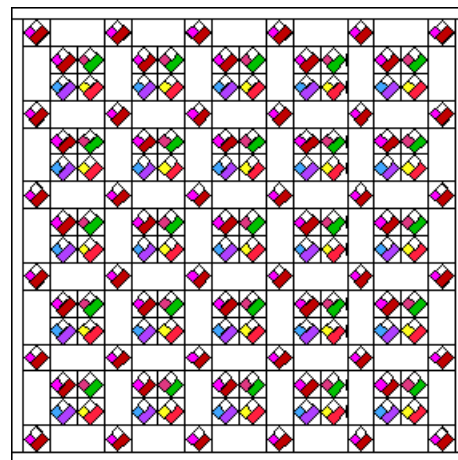
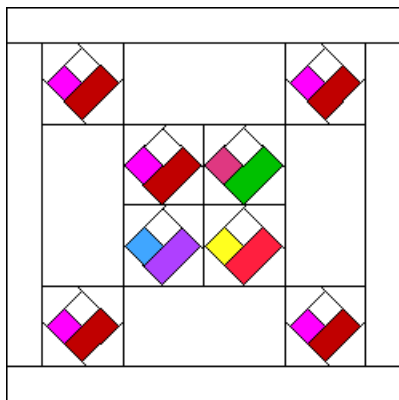
Full/Queen Quilt – Make (7) Row



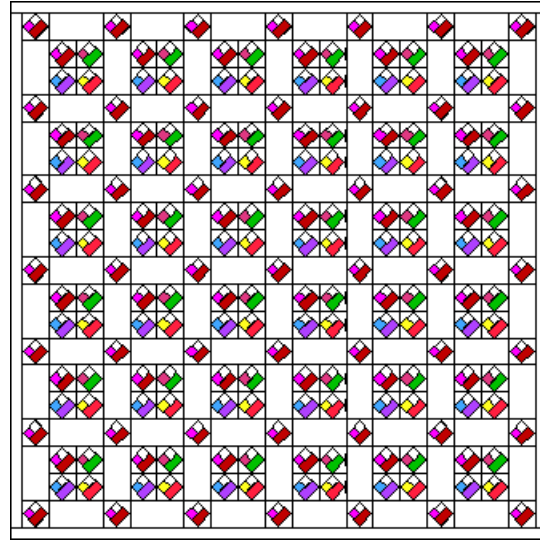
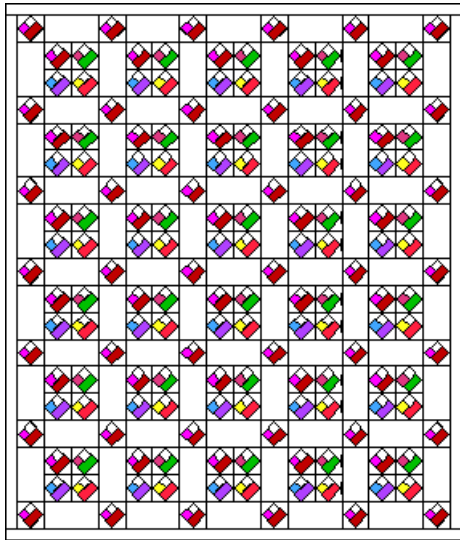
Sew your Block Rows and Sashing Rows together. Nest Seams.

Press to the Sashing Rows.
