

# Dutch Nine Patch Quilt Blocks

## 9” block (finished size) and 13.5” block (finished size)

### Pieces to cut for each block:

| 9 Inch Blocks | 3.5” squares colored fabric | 3.5” squares background fabric | 1.5” squares colored fabric | 1.5” squares background fabric |
|---------------|-----------------------------|--------------------------------|-----------------------------|--------------------------------|
| Block A       | 4                           | 4                              | 5                           | 4                              |
| Block B       | 4                           | 4                              | 4                           | 5                              |

### The 13.5” block is perfect for Charm Packs

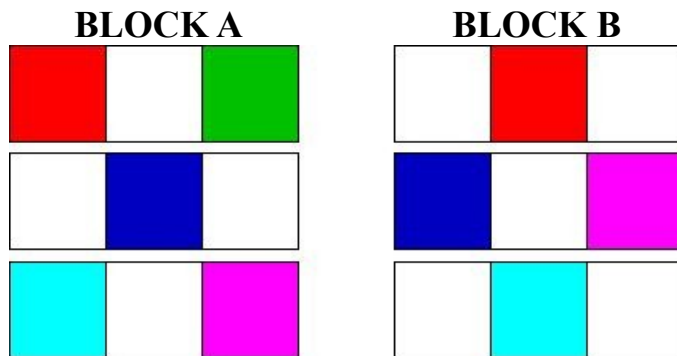
You can cut the (4) 2” squares from each charm in addition to using the 5” charms for the bigger squares.

| 13.5 Inch Blocks | 5” squares colored fabric | 5” squares background fabric | 2” squares colored fabric | 2” squares background fabric |
|------------------|---------------------------|------------------------------|---------------------------|------------------------------|
| Block A          | 4                         | 4                            | 5                         | 4                            |
| Block B          | 4                         | 4                            | 4                         | 5                            |

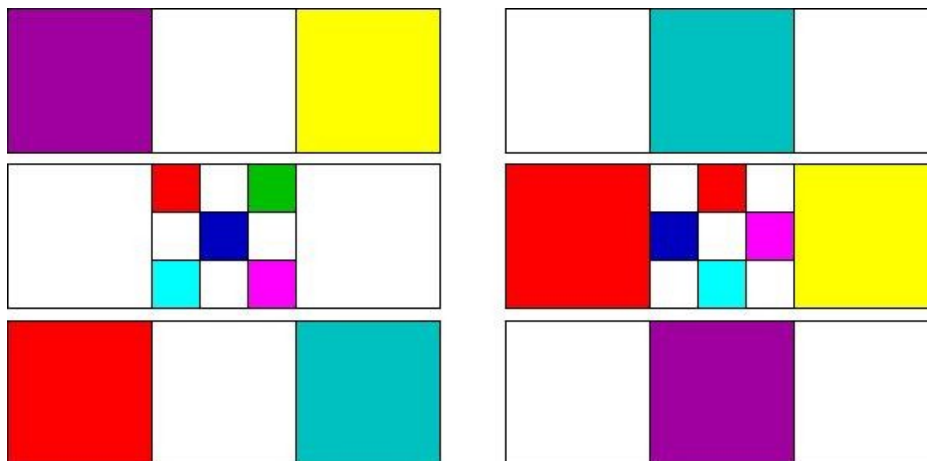
**Block Construction (directions are the same for the 9” and 13.5” blocks):**

*Use 1/4” seams throughout the blocks.*

1. Make the center first.
2. Sew the small squares into rows according to the diagram below.
3. Press to the darker fabric.
4. Sew the rows together nesting seams. Press seams in either direction.



5. Sew rows of the larger squares together according to diagrams below.
6. Block A – Press to the background fabric. Block B – Press to the colored fabric.
7. Sew rows together nesting seams. Press seams in either direction.
