Fabric Requirements and Cutting Directions

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Fabric Requirements

You can purchase your Jelly Roll
or
make your own from your stash which is what I do.

Choose the size of quilt you want to make
Here are the number of strips (2.5" by 42/44") of fabric you will need.

Three sizes:

Larger Comfort Quilt - 78" by 78"

(40) 2.5" strips (Most Jelly Rolls have 40 strips)

3 1/8 yards background fabric

Comfort Quilt - 58" by 78"

(32) 2.5" strips

2 1/2 yards background fabric

Lap Quilt or Baby Quilt - 58" by 58"

(23) 2.5" strips

1 3/4 yards background fabric

Cutting Directions

78" by 78" Larger Comfort Quilt

Jelly Roll Strips – (40) 2.5" by 42/44" strips (you may need (2) additional strips from your stash that blend with the Jelly Roll strips if your strips are less than 44". See directions below.)





CUT STRIPS INTO PIECES ACCORDING TO THE CHART BELOW:

Total pieces needed in each size

(72) 2.5" by 10.5" rectangles

(48) 2.5" by 6.5" rectangles

(248) 2.5" squares

	2.5" by 10.5" rectangles	6.5" by 2.5" rectangles	2.5" squares
32 Strips - From each strip cut 	2	1	5* or 6
8 Strips – From each strip cut 	1	2	7
<p>* If you cut (5) 2.5" squares from the 32 strips you need (2) more 2.5" by 42" strips from your stash that blend with the Jelly Roll strips. Cut these strips into (32) 2.5" squares.</p>			32
<p>Background Fabric</p> <p>Cut background fabric into (44) 2.5" by 42/44" strips</p> <p>Total pieces needed in each size</p> <p>(75) 2.5" by 10.5" rectangles</p> <p>(50) 2.5" by 6.5" rectangles</p> <p>(244) 2.5" squares</p>			
(33) 2.5" strips – from each strip cut 	2	1	5
(8) 2.5" strips – from each strip cut 	1	2	7
(1) 2.5" strip	1	1	10
(2) 2.5" strips			21

Jelly Roll Strips – (32) 2.5" by 42/44" strips




(200) 2.5" squares

Jelly Roll Strips – (23) 2.5" by 42/44" strips




(36) 2.5" by 10.5" rectangles

(24) 2.5" by 6.5" rectangles

(160) 2.5" squares

(12) 2.5" strips – from each strip cut 	2	1	5
(10) 2.5" strips – from each strip cut 	1	1	10
(1) 2.5" strip	3	1	
(1) 2.5" strip	2	3
