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

Supplies:




I strongly suggest purchasing the Lazy Angle ruler or the Tri-Rec rulers or other similar tool to make your star points.

Block Size – 12” (12.5” unfinished)









Fabric Requirements:

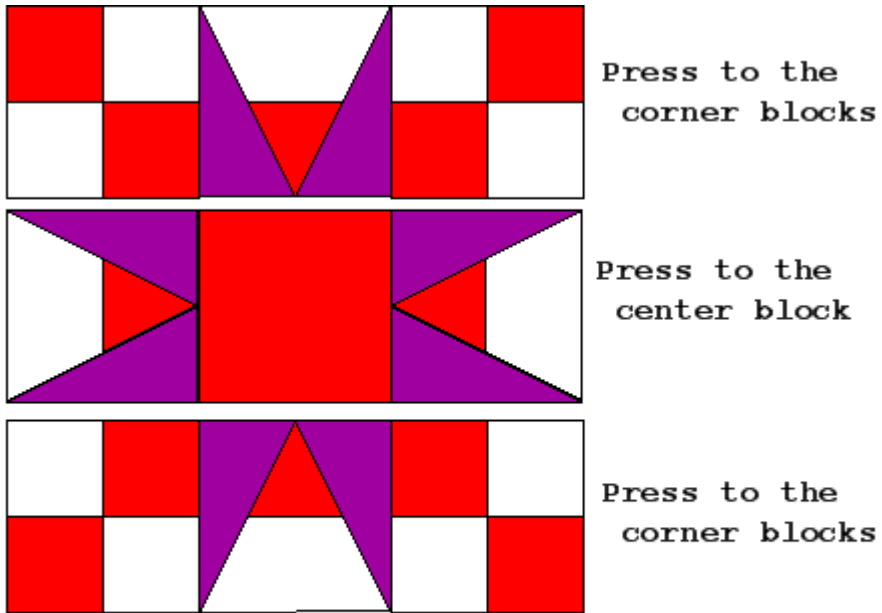
	(8) 2.5” squares (1) 4.5” square
	(8) 2.5” squares

	<p>(4) 2.5" by 4.5" rectangles</p>
	<p>(4) 2.5" by 4.5" rectangles</p>
	<p>(8) Star Points.. fabric based on the method you use.</p> <p>I use the Lazy Angle Rule and cut a 4.5" by 15" strip. I then cut the points from this strip using the ruler.</p>

Assembling Your Block

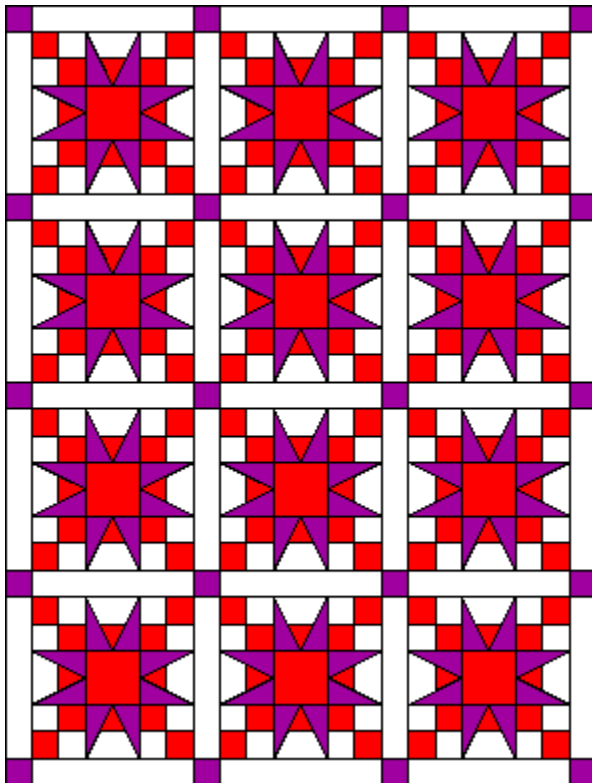
<p>A</p>		<p>Make (8) of this unit. You are sewing your 2.5" squares together. Press to the dark.</p>
<p>B</p>		<p>Make (4) of this unit, nesting the seams. I press all the seams in the same direction. I pick open the couple of stitches in the center and press that open to avoid bulk.</p>

<p>C</p>		<p>Make (4) of this unit. You are sewing your 4.5" by 2.5" rectangles together. Press to the dark.</p>
<p>D</p>		<p>Cut your (4) Unit C into this triangle shape using your Lazy Angle Ruler.</p>
<p>E</p>		<p>Cut (8)</p>
<p>F.</p>		<p>Sew Units D and E together to make (4). Press to the star points.</p> <p>Take care to sew this accurately so that you have your quarter inch seam allowances. If you are not careful you will cut off your points.</p>

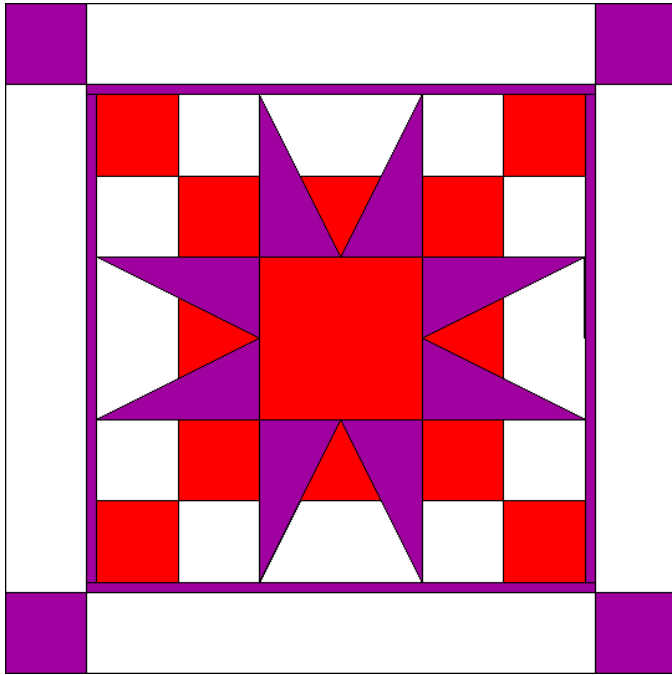





Press the seams joining the rows to the center of the block

Sample Quilt Layout – Sashing – 2.5” by 12.5”, Cornerstones – 2.5” by 2.5”



Borders for the Doll Quilt. (Finished Size 16.5” by 16.5”)



	<p>(2) ¾ “ by 12 ½ “ rectangles (2) ¾ “ by 13” rectangles</p> <p>I used a striped fabric for this and the border. I cut the fabric on the bias for the border.</p>
	<p>(4) 13” by 2.5” rectangles</p>
	<p>(4) 2.5” squares</p>

Assembling Your Doll Quilt

- Step 1:** Sew the $\frac{3}{4}$ " by $12 \frac{1}{2}$ " rectangles to either side of the block.
Press to the rectangles.
- Step 2:** Sew the $\frac{3}{4}$ " by 13" rectangles to the top and bottom of the block.
Press to the rectangles.
- Step 3:** Sew a 2.5" square to either end of (2) of the 2.5" by 13" rectangles.
Press to the squares.
- Step 4:** Sew the 2.5" by 13" rectangles without the squares to either side of your quilt.
Press to the rectangles.
- Step 5:** Sew the units from Step 3 to the top and bottom.
Press to the rectangles.
- Step 6:** Quilt and bind.
