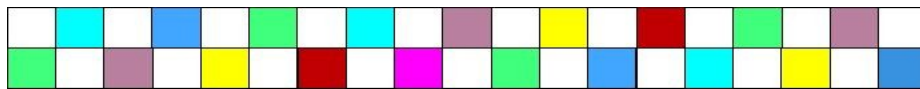
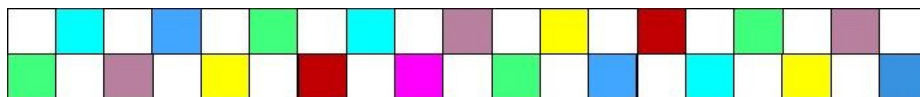

### Clue #12-Borders (Optional)

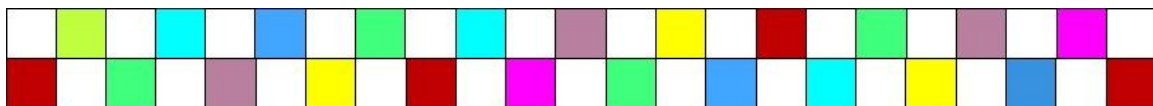
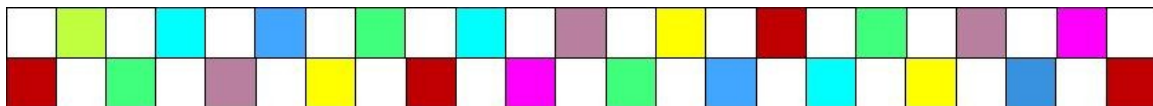
(If you are using 6.5" 4-Patch blocks to make your border please skip to Page 3.)

#### Lap/Twin

1. Gather your quilt top from Clue #11 and your border squares from Baggie G.  
You need 84 spring colored fabric squares and 84 background fabric squares.
2. Sew each spring colored square to a background square. Press to the spring colored square.
3. Sew 19 of your pairs from Step 2 together in a row, alternating the light and dark squares. Press in either direction.
4. Make 2 and sew to both sides of your quilt.  
Press to the long strip.

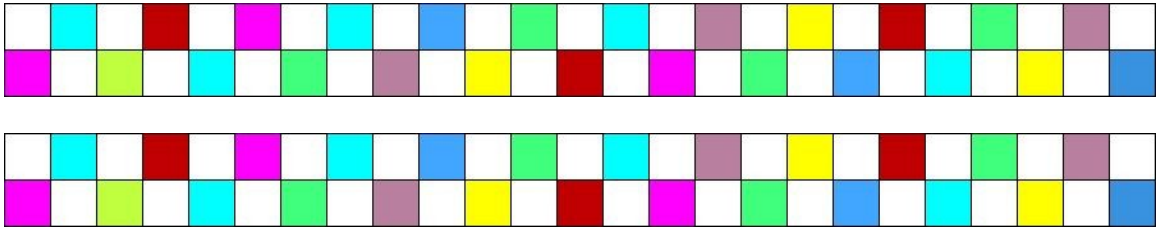


5. Sew 23 pairs from Step 2 together in a row, alternating light and dark squares. Press in either direction.
6. Make 2, and sew one to the top and one to the bottom of your quilt.  
Press to the long strip.

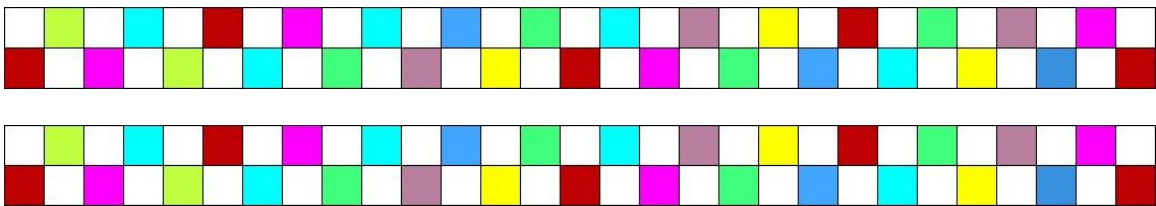


## Full

1. Gather your quilt top from Clue #11 and your border squares from Baggie G.  
You need 108 spring colored fabric squares and 108 background fabric squares.
2. Sew each spring colored square to a background square. Press to the spring colored square.
3. Sew 25 of your pairs from Step 2 together in a row, alternating the light and dark squares. Press in either direction.
4. Make 2 and sew to both sides of your quilt.  
Press to the long strip.



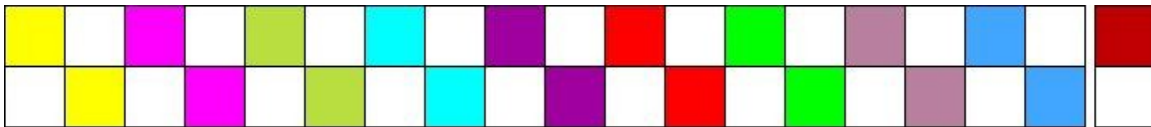
5. Sew 29 pairs from Step 2 together in a row, alternating light and dark squares.  
Press in either direction.
6. Make 2, and sew one to the top and one to the bottom of your quilt.  
Press to the long strip.



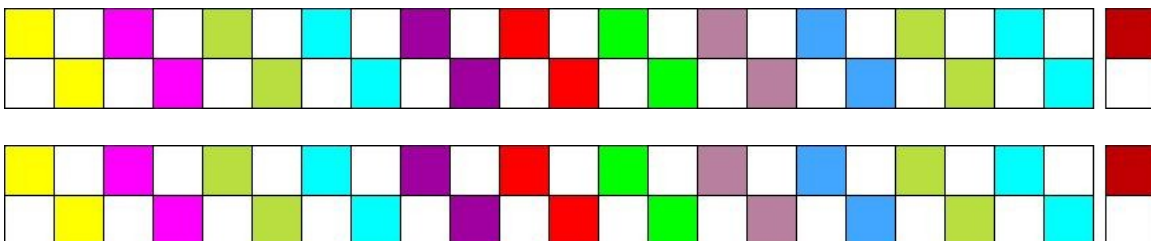
## Making Your Border Using 6.5” 4-Patch Blocks

### Lap/Twin

1. **Make 4 blocks with one background square and one spring fabric square. You can sew these from 3.5” squares or take (2) of your 4-Patch blocks apart so you have four units.**
2. **Sew (9) 4-Patch blocks in a row and add one of the two block units to the end. Sew 2. Press in either direction.**
3. **Sew one to each side of your quilt and press to the long strip.**



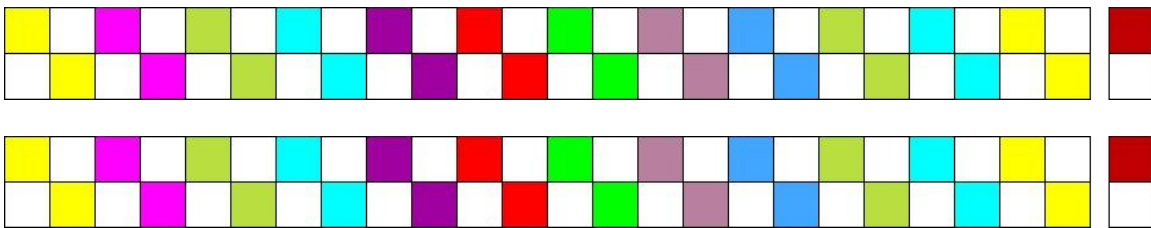
4. **Sew (11) 4-Patch blocks in a row and add one of the two block units to the end. Sew 2. Press in either direction.**
5. **Sew one to the top and one to the bottom of your quilt. Press to the long strip.**



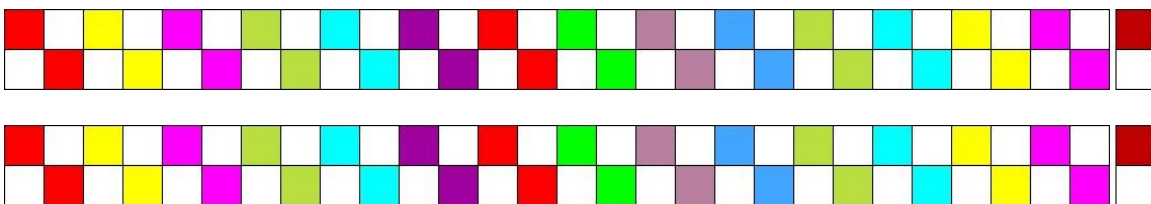
## Making Your Border Using 6.5" 4-Patch Blocks

### Full

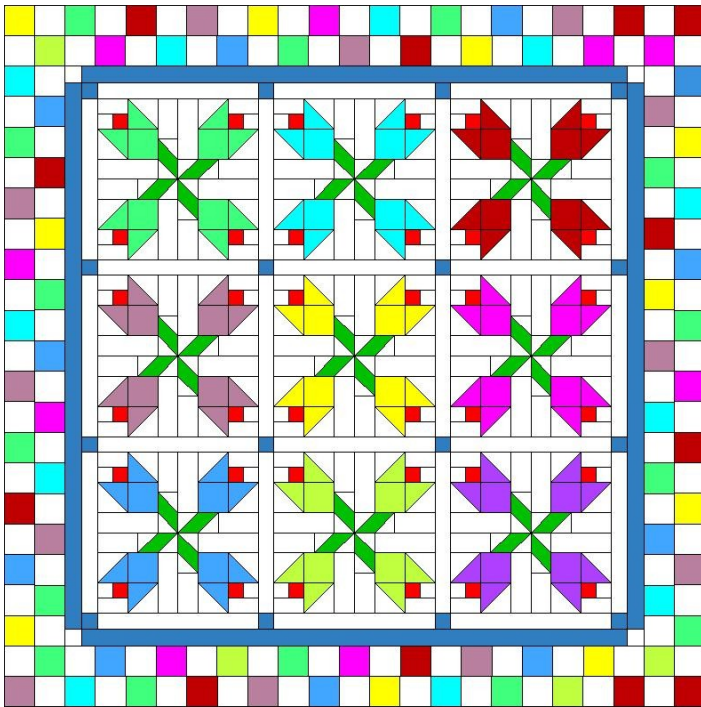
1. **Make 4 blocks with one background square and one spring fabric square.**  
You can sew these from 3.5" squares or take (2) of your 4-Patch blocks apart so you have four units.
2. **Sew (12) 4-Patch blocks in a row and add one of the two block units to the end. Sew 2. Press in either direction.**
3. **Sew one to each side of your quilt and press to the long strip.**



4. **Sew (14) 4-Patch blocks in a row and add one of the two block units to the end. Sew 2. Press in either direction.**
5. **Sew one to the top and one to the bottom of your quilt. Press to the long strip.**
