Cutting Directions:

Label 5 little sandwich baggies A thru E

1 1/8 Yard Background Fabric

1 Yard Foreground Fabric

This is a two color quilt

WOF=Width of Fabric..at least 42"

Background Fabric

(1) Strip 2.5" by WOF - Crosscut into (12) 2.5" squares

(3) Strips 4.5" by WOF - Crosscut into (27) 4.5" squares

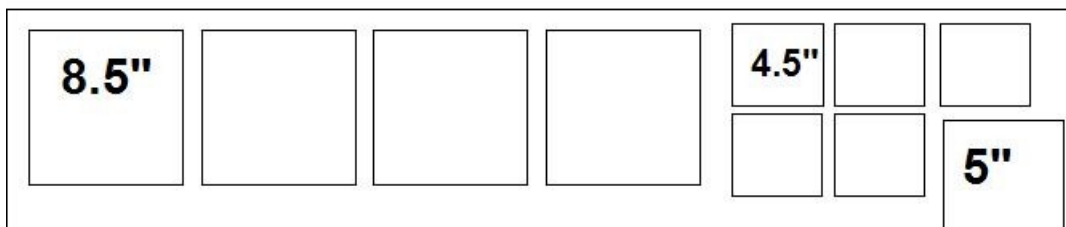
(1) Strip 5" by WOF - Crosscut into (8) 5" squares

(1) Strip 6" by WOF - Crosscut into (4) 6" squares and (3) 5" squares

(1) Strip 9.5" by WOF - Crosscut into (4) 8.5" squares and (5) 4.5" squares and

(1) 5" square

9.5" by WOF of Fabric



Organize your squares into the following labelled baggies:

Baggie A - (4) 8.5" squares

Baggie A - (28) 4.5" squares

Baggie B - (12) 5" squares

Baggie C - (4) 4.5" squares

Baggie D - (4) 6" squares

Baggie E - (12) 2.5" squares

Foreground Fabric

WOF=Width of Fabric..at least 42"

(1) Strip 2.5" by WOF - Crosscut into (13) 2.5" squares

(3) Strips 4.5" by WOF - Crosscut into (27) 4.5" squares

(1) Strip 5" by WOF - Crosscut into (8) 5" squares

(1) Strip 5.5" by WOF - Crosscut into (4) 5" squares and (4) 5.5" squares

(1) Strip 6" by WOF - Crosscut into (4) 6" squares and (1) 4.5" square

Organize your squares into the following labelled baggies:

Baggie A - (28) 4.5" squares

Baggie B - (12) 5" squares

Baggie C - (4) 5.5" squares

Baggie D - (4) 6" squares

Baggie E - (13) 2.5" squares
