**Fabric Requirements and Cutting Directions**  
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**2 sizes:**

**Baby/Lap Quilt:** 44" by 44"

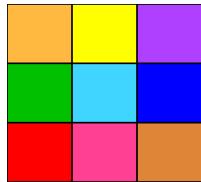
**Comfort Quilt:** 56" by 68" (This is a good width for a comfort quilt if you want to back it with Minkie, cuddle fabric or fleece which is usually 58" to 60" wide.)

**Fabric Requirements**

**Solid Colored Fabrics – Choose your own colors**

Each fabric can be cut from a 3.5" strip or from some pieces in your stash.



**Baby Quilt:**

From each of (9) fabrics cut:

- (4) 3.5" by 4" rectangles
- (4) 1.5" by 4.5" rectangles

**Comfort Quilt:**

From each of (20) fabrics cut: (some of these fabrics can be repeats)

Use a minimum of 9 fabric colors

- (4) 3.5" by 4" rectangles

- (3) 1.5" by 4.5" rectangles

**If you plan on trading this fabric at retreat you need (4) of the 1.5" by 4.5" size because you will be trading with others who will be making the smaller quilt and need (4).**

## **Fabric Requirements continued Background and Accent Fabrics**

**I am assuming your fabric is at least 42” wide.**

**I am using light gray for my background, you can use the solid color of your choice.**

**Use black for one of your accent fabrics**

**Use any other color that you like as your second accent fabric.**

**½ yard**

#### **Background Fabric**

**2 ¼ yards**

#### **Black Fabric**

**½ yard**

#### **Accent Fabric**

**¾ yard**

## Cutting Directions

### Background Fabric

Baby/Lap Quilt	Comfort Quilt
<p>Cut (4) 4.5” by Width of Fabric Strips</p> <p>Then Cut:            (36) 1.5” by 4.5” rectangles            (36) 2.5” by 4.5” rectangles</p>	<p>Cut <b>(5 or 6)</b> 4.5” by Width of Fabric Strips</p> <p>Then Cut:            (54) 1.5” by 4.5” rectangles            (54) 2.5” by 4.5” rectangles</p> <p><b>If your fabric is wider you may get by with 5 strips. Cut 5 strips into the smaller rectangles first then cut the 6<sup>th</sup> strip if you need it.</b></p>
<p>Cut <b>(5)</b> 3.5” by Width of Fabric Strips.  <b>If you have extra left from your 4.5” strips you can trim that strip to 3.5”</b></p> <p>Then Cut:            (36) 1.5” by 3.5” rectangles            (36) 2” by 3.5” rectangles            (8) 3.5” by 6.5” rectangles            (4) 3.5” squares</p>	<p>Cut <b>(8 or 9)</b> 3.5” by Width of Fabric Strips            Cut (8) first and then if you need it cut one more.</p> <p><b>If you have extra left from your 4.5” strips you can trim that strip to 3.5”</b></p> <p>Then Cut:            (80) 1.5” by 3.5” rectangles            (80) 2” by 3.5” rectangles            (14) 3.5” by 6.5” rectangles            (4) 3.5” squares</p>
<p>Cut (3) 2.5” by Width of Fabric Strips.  <b>If you have extra left from your 3.5” strips you can trim that strip to 2.5”</b></p> <p>Then Cut:            (36) 2.5” squares</p>	<p>Cut (5) 2.5” by Width of Fabric Strips. Cut (5) first and then if you need it cut one more.  <b>If you have extra left from your 3.5” strips you can trim that strip to 2.5”</b></p> <p>Then Cut:            (80) 2.5” squares</p>

## Cutting Directions Continued

### Black Fabric

<b>Baby/Lap Quilt</b>	<b>Comfort Quilt</b>
Cut (3) 2.5" by Width of Fabric Strips.  Then Cut: (36) 2.5" squares	Cut (5) 2.5" by Width of Fabric Strips.  Then Cut: (80) 2.5" squares

### Second Accent Fabric

<b>Baby/Lap Quilt</b>	<b>Comfort Quilt</b>
Cut (1) 6.5" by Width of Fabric Strip.  Then Cut: (4) 6.5" squares  Cut remainder of strip into (2) 2.5" strips. Then cut strips into (9) 2.5" squares  Cut (1) 4.5" by Width of Fabric Strip Then cut (4) 4.5" squares from the strip	Cut (2) 6.5" by Width of Fabric Strips.  Then Cut: (12) 6.5" squares  Cut (1) 2.5" by Width of Fabric Strip Then cut (15) 2.5" squares  Cut (1) 4.5" by Width of Fabric Strip Then cut (4) 4.5" squares from the strip  Cut (1) 12.5" by 4.5" strip from the remainder of your 4.5" strip. Trim this strip to 12.5" by 2.5" Then cut (5) 2.5" squares to give you a total of (20)
